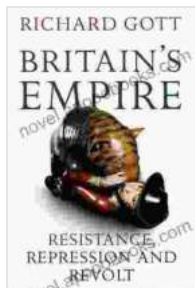

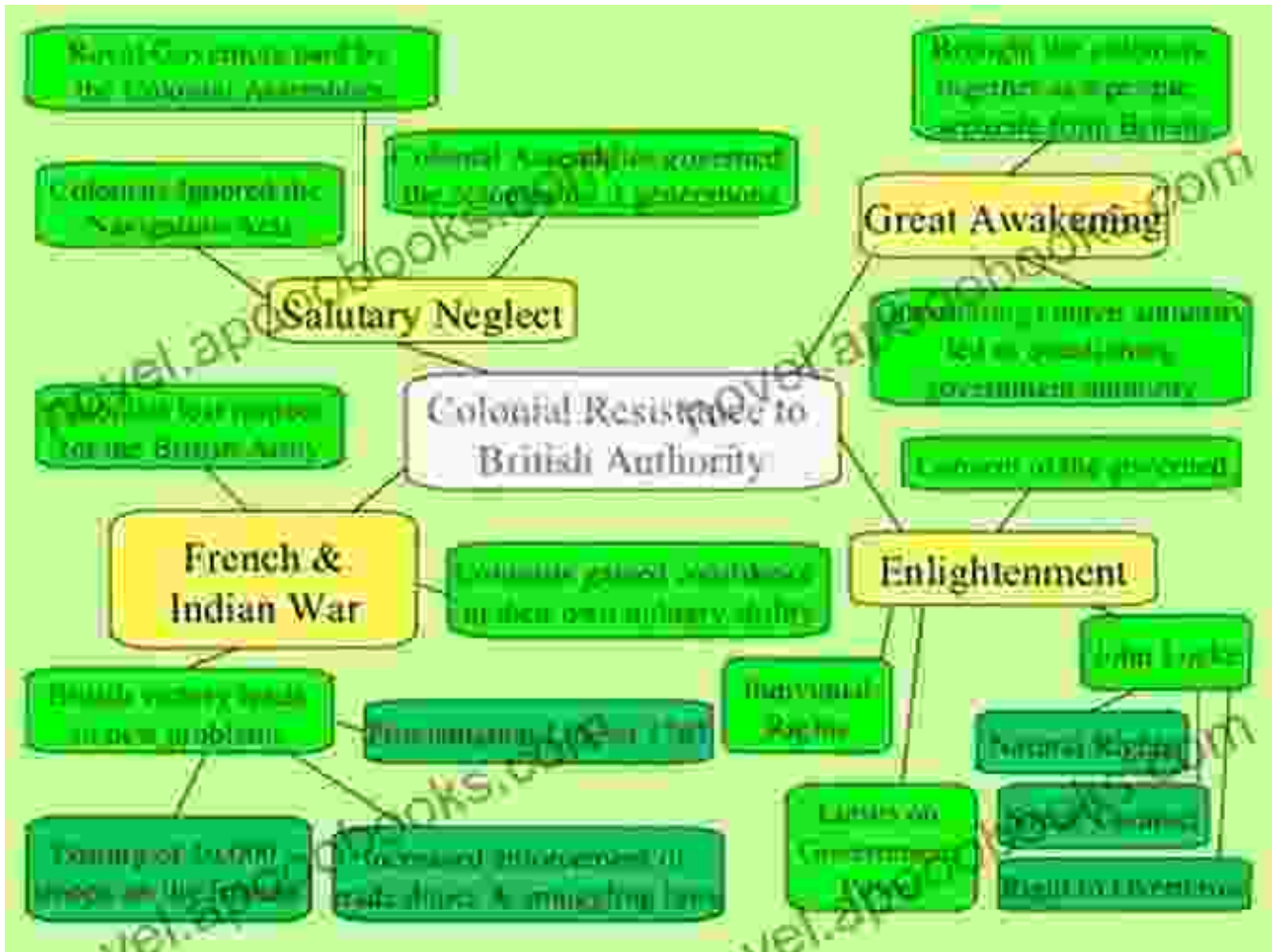

- ❖ In 1997, Britain formally handed Hong Kong back to China.

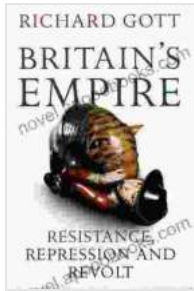

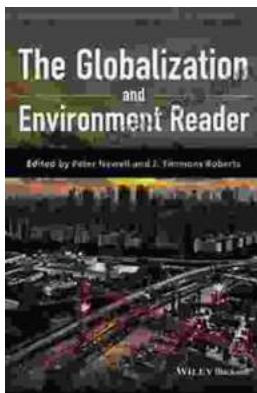
