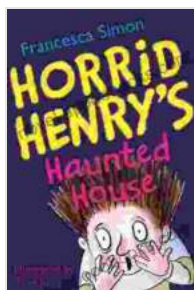

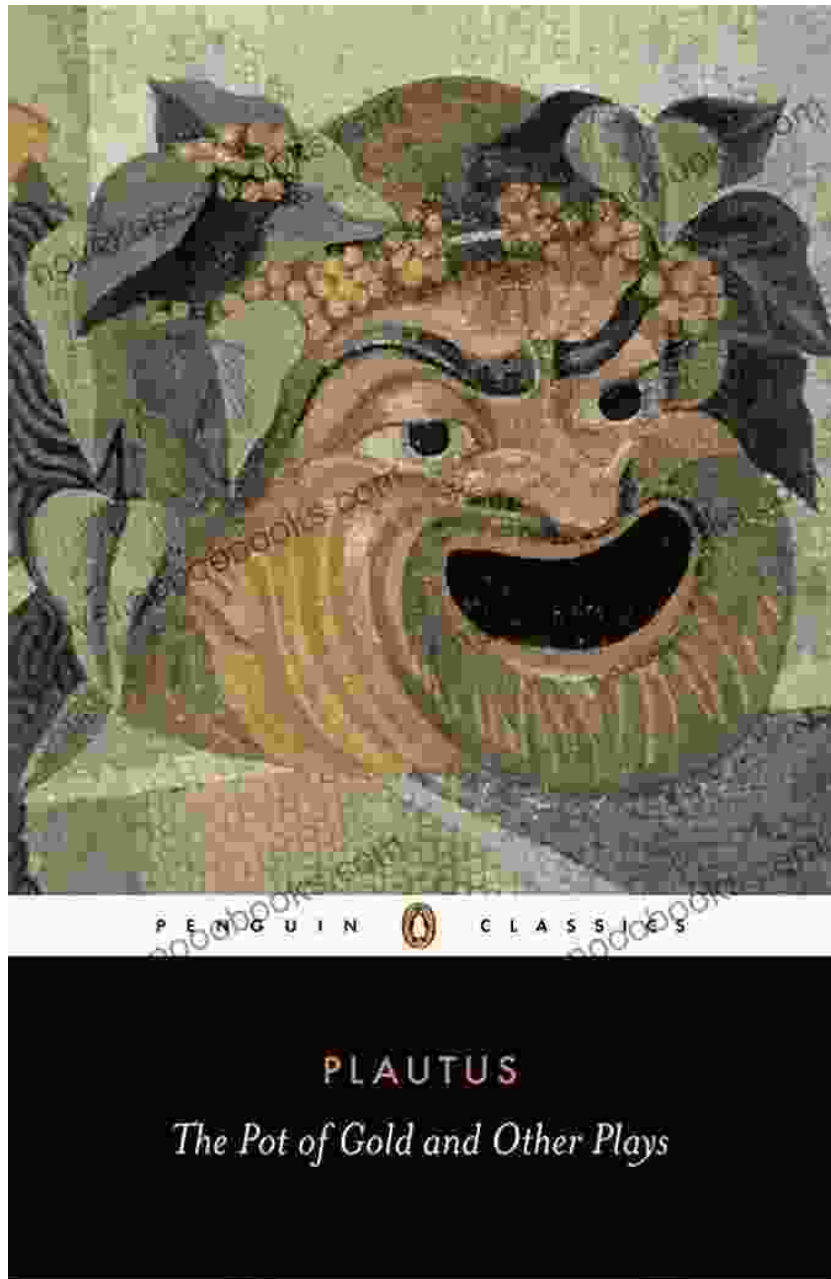
leading to a series of hilarious misunderstandings. The play explores the themes of identity and mistaken identity, and it is considered one of the earliest examples of the "twin farce" genre.

The Pot of Gold



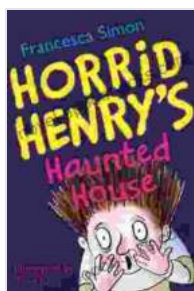

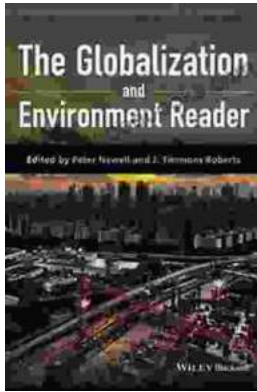
